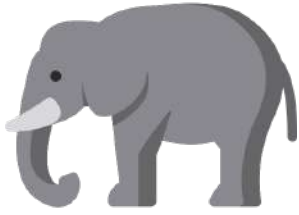
Instructions

Give each pair or small group of students a set of cards and explain that they have to take it in turns to place a card in a chain, similar to dominoes. When they place a card they have to make an accurate and logical comparative sentence with the card that they place it next to, for example: *A mouse is smaller than an elephant.*

When a comparative adjective has been used once, it can't be used again for the rest of the game. The first person to place all of their cards is the winner.

No-cut option: Students take it in turns to choose two of the pictures to make comparative sentences. If it's correct, they can mark those pictures as theirs. The winner is the person who has the most pictures at the end of the game.

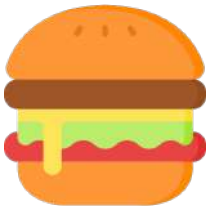

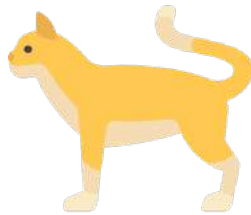

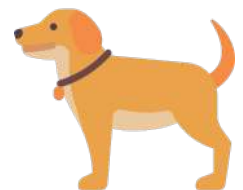
