

# Who Has the Cutest Pet?

Superlatives



## Level

Pre-intermediate

## Time

30 minutes

## Language Focus

Superlative adjectives  
Comparative adjectives

## Preparation

Copy and cut up the cards. If you have more than 12 students in your class it's possible to have duplicate cards.

## Instructions

Give each student one card.

Explain that they have to find the answer by speaking to everybody in the class. They need a separate piece of paper to write notes to remember what people said.

Before students begin talking to each other, give them some time to think of suitable questions to ask and check this with them.

For example, for the card *Who has the cutest pet?*, the student could ask;  
*Do you have a pet? What pet do you have? What's it like?*

Now get students to go around asking and answering questions, making notes of the answers they get.

When they've finished, put them into groups to share the information they gathered and come to a group decision to answer the question on their cards. Students should be encouraged to use comparative forms at this point, for example; *I think that Ali's cat is cuter than Carla's hamster.*

Get groups to share the answers they found to the questions on the cards.
